Cook/Meal Prep-Use your culinary skills to prepare meals for 20-35 students for in-home residential program for college bound youth. Previous experience cooking for large groups and food safety knowledge required. Must be able to lift semi-heavy materials. Tuesdays, Wednesdays and Thursdays from 3 p.m. - 7 p.m. also possibly Saturdays 9 a.m. - 1 p.m. There is a minimum commitment of one shift twice a month. Located in Garfield Heights, contact Nadine.

Driver- Help a scholar succeed by driving them to tutoring sessions. Drivers pick up students at school and drop off after tutoring sessions on campus in Garfield Heights. You may use your own vehicle or the vehicle provided by the nonprofit. Volunteers must be 21 years of age, have a valid driver's license, your own liability/automobile coverage, and willing to undergo a screening process, training and criminal background check. Days needed: Tuesday-Saturday, times vary. Minimum commitment-once a week. Contact Nadine.

ESL tutor: Help tutor adults from other countries in the English language, using a unique visual curriculum. Volunteer times needed are every Tuesday from 7 p.m. - 8:30 PM at the Shaker Heights library. Contact Jan.

Field Trip Chaperone: You would assist school groups on trips through a downtown science museum. Dates needed include Feb 3, 4, 5,10,11. Times 9:30 a.m. - 2 p.m. Training is provided. Background check required. Volunteers receive free parking. Contact Nadine.

Food Pantry: Help is needed to organize, stock and inventory a food pantry, serving Cleveland's west side and maintain client/service data information. Must have a valid Ohio driver's license. Days/times needed are Monday and/or Friday from 10 a.m. - 2 p.m. Contact Jan.

Friendly Visitors: Cheer up a Hospice patient either in a local nursing home or in their home. Flexible days and times. There is a mandatory background check. Contact Lynette.

Fundraising: Assist the development team at Alzheimer's Association by seeking in-kind donations and planning for various fundraising events throughout the year at their Beachwood office. Contact Sue.

Math Tutors: Help a child succeed in school grades K-2 in Cleveland's east side. K-8 schools are Cleveland's west side. Also needed are Reading Mentors and Library Aides. A background check is required, Flexible days and hours, during the school day. Contact Lynette.

Road To Recovery Coordinator: This is a volunteer from home opportunity. Coordinate drivers in an assigned area of Greater Cleveland. Receive patient's request information from the agency and distribute it to the local drivers via email and/or telephone. Provide status and necessary documentation concerning filled and unfilled transportation requests. Ensure timely communication to staff partners, volunteer drivers and patients when issues occur. May drive patients to appointments, if desired. Must have access to email and phone. Good communication skills a must. Training and back ground check provided by agency. Contact Nadine.

Skilled Trades Assistant: Help identify and sort donated pieces, make minor repairs and assist with pricing at west side resale home improvement store. Volunteers should have a working knowledge and expertise in electrical, plumbing, door hardware, lighting and tools. Needed Tuesday thru Friday, 9 a.m.-4 p.m. once a week. Contact Sue.

Skilled Trades Mentor: Help train and teach new employees their particular skilled trade, i.e., carpentry, plumbing, roofing, electrical and more. Days/times needed: Monday thru Friday 9 a.m. - 5 p.m., flexible within those hours. No background check required. East side. Contact Jan.
