Encore Initiative - Moving Us Forward



Greater Cleveland Volunteers is finishing up its first year of Encore programming to expand volunteer opportunities for people age 50+ through the Encore Cleveland initiative. This effort led by the Cleveland Foundation, promotes the value of older adults and provides a wide range of opportunities to engage in a new career (paid or unpaid) to improve the community. As part of this initia-



tive, we have expanded our AARP Experience Corps program and identified several other high priority volunteer needs in our My Mentor My Friend and RSVP programs that talented adults can help address.

We recently received additional funding from the Cleveland Foundation to promote our Encore volunteer opportunities. With this support, we are expanding our Refer a Friend contest to run year-round. Drawings will be held each quarter. One of the most effective ways we engage new volunteers is by our current volunteers telling someone about their experiences and suggesting that they contact Greater Cleveland Volunteers. As part of the continued expansion of our AARP Experience Corps program, we will be adding more schools and more tutors in the fall. If you know anyone that might be interested in being a literacy tutor, please let us know. We have also created a new leadership volunteer role in the program - a "Team Leader". 
