

From Helping Youth to Adults Norm enjoys it all







His 2012 re-establishment in Cleveland also provided some time for him to contribute to the community in a new way. He coveted the kind of one to one direct service contact he had not had since the early days of his extensive professional career. Norm saw a flyer from Greater Cleveland Volunteers, attended an orientation, and started volunteering in the My Mentor My Friend program. "It was fun mentoring. I wanted to be more of a direct contact," he said. "That minimal amount of time can have such an impact on a kid – on the way they feel about themselves."

After three years of mentoring, Norm became involved at the 2100 Lakeside Men's Shelter. Some 400 men stay at the shelter nightly, in various stages of crisis and transition. At the shelter, Norm assists the men in their search for affordable area housing and helps to conduct mock employment interviews. Because of past offenses, finding hous-

ing and employment can be very difficult. Volunteering at the shelter has become an integral part of Norm's life. Norm reflects, "I love this opportunity...the whole homeless service world is very complex, and if is for me, it must also be for them."

One success was a man for whom Norm could not secure housing. One day the man tracked down Norm to tell him he had found an apartment on his own, only because of Norm's support and guidance and wanted to thank him. Norm asked why, the man replied, "Because you tried." They still keep in contact.

Norm is quick to applaud the folks who manage the programs partnered with Greater Cleveland Volunteers. He calls them "unbelievably supportive and responsive."

Westlake Meals on Wheels

Serving the community for 40+ years



Westlake Meals on Wheels is a nonprofit community service that has served the citizens of Westlake since 1975. The program prepares and delivers a variety of nutritious meals to

Westlake residents who find it difficult to purchase or prepare food.

The organization is unique in that it does not receive federal, state or local government funding. Rather, it relies on community support and private payments. Meal recipients - or a designated person - are billed on a monthly basis.

They have 75 volunteers a week who prepare the food and deliver the meals under the direction of a Head Cook. Drivers deliver a hot meal and a cold meal in the same delivery each day between 11:00 a.m. and 12:00 p.m. to over 50 clients.

Greater Cleveland Volunteers is helping with recruiting kitchen helpers and bakers, who will assist in the preparation and packing of meals and dessert treats for their clients.

EYEJ empowers and amplifies the voices of teens and pre-teens by bridging them with diverse individuals to engage in interactive discussions centered around social justice.

They accomplish this through a Discussion Series in schools. They are serving over 300 students and are doubling in size!

Volunteers are what make EYEJ happen. The Speaker and Coordinator Volunteers for their Discussion Series discuss various topics in one hour with students such as; Stress and the Brain, Education, Money, Health, Community Relationships, Race & Justice, Empowerment and Power & Priviledge. They prepare all of the content and activities for each volunteer. They pair the speakers with a partner and a coordinator—- it's fun, engaging and easy.
