Thousands of people poured into the Mall in downtown Cleveland on Saturday, September 23, to celebrate volunteerism and all things pickles. The fifth annual event was held under perfect skies with dozens of vendors and food trucks on hand.

Attendance was brisk all day, with an estimated 7,200 people enjoying the festival.

The music stage featured two bands, with Billy Likes Soda returning again to lead off the afternoon. Later, Centric Soul took the stage to round out the day.

In between the two bands, the much-anticipated pickle-eating contests took place, one for children 14 and under, the other for adults.
