## HELPING VETERANS WHO HAVE HELPED US

Although November 11<sup>th</sup> is officially Veterans Day, you have an opportunity to honor veterans all year and give some much needed help to their well-being.

The Volunteers of America of Greater Ohio Veterans Domiciliary at Wade Park is a state of the art residential care facility that combines rehabilitative clinical services with supportive case management services for homeless veterans. The facility houses about 116-122 veterans, of which 9-14 are women, for up to nine months or longer depending on the need and evaluations.

The various supportive services include:

- Case management
- Vocational assessments and services
- Mental health assessments and services
- · Substance abuse assessments and
- Employment services
- Legal services
- Recreational assessments and therapy

As service needs increased the staff discovered more help was necessary. An employee who volunteers with Greater Cleveland Volunteers suggested a possible connection. Kathryn Lecklider, communications director, explains the organization's perspective. "Greater Cleveland Volunteers has a good process of not only promoting volunteer needs, but also effectively recruiting and then staying connected with the Partner Agency."

Greater Cleveland Volunteers is hoping to provide volunteers to serve as **instructors in aerobic**, **yoga and zumba classes** (on Thursday evenings or Saturdays) **as well as teaching basic computer skills in Microsoft Word.**

### TUTORING AND MENTORING NEWS

#### **PROUD AFFILIATE**



Guiding the next generation of readers.

AARP Experience Corps has begun tutoring in 13 schools in the Cleveland Metropolitan School District. We are fortunate to start nearly 40 new tutors this year along with veterans making our total nearly 200. Pre-service trainings, school orientations and matching are finished and we are settling down to tutor.

Last year's outcomes were great: Tutors gave over 50,000 hours of service. 95% have been in the program for two years or more. 87% of teachers rated *Tutor impact* on their students as moderate to very strong across all reading skills with some improving a full grade level.

My Mentor, My Friend mentors have begun to meet their students during their lunch time in the four mentoring schools. A group of over 45 mentors are slated to work with students in grades 4-6 again this year with additional folks still to join them.

More than 85% of all students and mentors surveyed last year believed the mentoring relationship helped improve student behavior, self-confidence and ability to stay out of trouble.

Thank you to all the wonderful tutors and mentors who have decided to make a difference in the life a child. I know the 2012-2013 school year will be a great one!

# CASE STUDY BEING CONDUCTED

Have you had a stroke or a Transient Ischemic Attach (TIA- mini-stroke)?

Do you want to help develop a program for stroke recovery in African Americans?

Researchers at Case Western Reserve University (CWRU) and University Hospitals Case Medical Center are seeking participants to help them develop a program that would help African American men learn about stroke risk factors, and about how to best take care of their health after a stroke or TIA.

**What's involved:** participants will be asked to attend 5 -6 informational sessions over a period 8 months. These sessions will be held on the CWRU campus.

Who can participate: you may be able to join the project if you are an African American man, have had a stroke or TIA within the last six month, and has a care partner who is willing to attend the sessions with you.
