

### Chat Pals Bridges the Gap Between Generations Amidst Loneliness Epidemic

A recent NPR story highlighted the isolation and loneliness older adults sometimes feel, and how organizations throughout the country are stepping up. GCV's own Chat Pals program was created during the pandemic, connecting participants age 55+ with volunteers 18+.

Volunteers and participants are matched based on life experiences and interests, and the resulting weekly phone/video calls combat loneliness the participant may feel. And it benefits the volunteer as well!

## VOLUNTEER OPPORTUNITIES ABOUND IN HOUSING, HOMELESSNESS, HUNGER

Homelessness and food insecurity are major challenges in the Cleveland area, but generous volunteers are making a dent in the problem. According to the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, one in seven people are food insecure, meaning they don't know where their next meal will come from. Food pantries and distribution points, staffed by volunteers, help to decrease these statistics.



Cleveland.com reports that the number of unhoused residents in Cuyahoga County has remained steady

at around 5,000 people over the last several years. In 2023, the County announced a plan to reduce homelessness by 25% by 2027 through a variety of measures, including increasing the housing capacity and connecting residents at risk of homelessness to support services in the area.

The interrelated issues of hunger, housing, and homelessness present many opportunities for volunteers, whether short-term or for longer assignments. The selfless work of volunteers in Northeast Ohio makes such a difference in the lives of those in need. See below for examples of the available opportunities.
